Core Values:


- **Relationships:** Lakers respect and value other people.

ENRICHING ACADEMICS THROUGH COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Established in 2007, the Skaneateles Education Foundation (SEF) is a nonprofit organization that functions as a conduit between our schools and the community. Through charitable community contributions, SEF supplements state and local funding of our schools by providing direct funding for academic programming that enriches the curriculum, improves student engagement, and inspires educational innovation.

Through our Laker Fund, SEF funds programs and grants that span all academic disciplines and grade levels. These initiatives include, but are not limited to, the funding of student programs, classes, equipment, guest speakers, performers, and staff and curriculum development. In addition to funding grants, SEF underwrites the Art Masterpiece program (K-5 supplemental art education) and the Student Advisory Council (providing a student voice and perspective to SEF).

In addition to the Laker Fund, SEF also manages four restricted funds comprised of the Music Guild (program for supporting and growing music education) and three Endowment Funds, which are the Class of '51 Fund (helps support financially disadvantaged students), Freedman Fund (supports programs and initiatives addressing the wellness curriculum and our students' mental health), and the Jean Graham Fund (summer sabbaticals for teachers to travel and pursue learning opportunities related to the subject area they teach).
