- Happy, healthy, well-rounded, and successful graduates who continue to tell us how well prepared they were for their college and career experiences.


Board of Education Elections:

What Voters Will See on May 21

The 2019-2020 Skaneateles Central Schools District budget that goes before voters on May 21 will include two propositions, which are indicated below:

Proposition I, General Fund Budget

(More Information Will Be Available Soon) The first proposition, as always, is the General Fund Budget.

Proposition II, School Bus Purchases

This proposition will ask that voters approve the purchase of four school buses, not to exceed \$435,000. This is the continuation of an innovative five year replacement and cost saving plan.

Safety & Security

Our \$100,000 capital outlay project for 2018-2019 will see a renovated vestibule constructed at State Street School. In 2019-2020, we are considering interior door replacement at the high school. This is part of a continued effort to provide the best means of safety & security within the district, while maintaining and enhancing learning spaces.

Project 2021 Timeline

Updates on the Project 2021 Timeline below:

- Phase 1 Plans Approved: The District's plans for Phase 1 of Project 2021, which includes work to remediate water issues in the basement of Waterman Primary School, have been approved by the State Education Department.
- **Phase 1 Bidding in February:** With that approval, work for Phase 1 went to bid last month.
- **Phase 1 Completion:** Phase 1 work is estimated to be completed during the summer of 2019.
- Phase 2 Approval: Plans for Phase 2, which includes the remainder of the project, went to the State Education Department in December, with an anticipated state approval in late spring of 2019.
- Phase 2 Bidding: Bidding is expected in the fall of 2019.
- Phase 2 Construction: Construction for Phase 2 of the project is expected to begin in early 2020.
