


# Comprehension Strategies



# Prediction



Predict



When you predict you use clues from the pictures, what you have read, or what you know to help you figure out what might come next in the story.

Prediction Words Include:


I think...

I predict....

Maybe....

# Question





When you question, you ask something that may be answered as you read, or after you have read.

Some questions can be found right in the text. They may begin with: who, where, compare, describe...

Some questions are **not** found in the text. They may begin with: What seems, How will, What if, How might...

# Summarize



## Summarize



When I summarize, I tell in my own words the important things I have read.

### Tips for Summarizing:

Include only important information

Combine ideas

Add connective words for clarity

Use category words instead of a list of words

A summary does **not** include your opinion, direct quotes, what you think the author should have said.

# Clarify



Clarify



You may need to clarify:  
an idea  
word meaning  
how to say a word

When you clarify an idea or word meaning,  
you re-read or use pictures.

When you clarify how to say a word, you  
look for chunks that you know.
